



Defining the Industry-Standard Healthcare Quality Workforce Competencies

In 2019, NAHQ published the first comprehensive framework of foundational, proficient and advanced competencies for the healthcare quality profession. NAHQ's Healthcare Quality Competency Framework sets specific job requirements and capabilities across eight domains, 29 competencies and 486 skill statements.

Collectively, the NAHQ Competency
Framework describes the
knowledge and skills required for
developing and leading a successful
healthcare quality professionals
should meet at least the foundational
level of capability in all eight domains,
but it is unlikely and unnecessary that
they will possess all competencies at an
advanced level. Instead, the spectrum should
be represented across each organization's
quality workforce.
